



FUN OWL FACTS

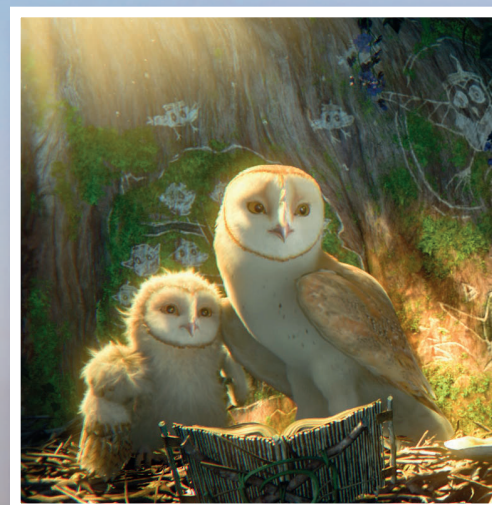
- ❖ **Did You Know?** There are lots of different owls—around 225 species in the world!
- ❖ **Did You Know?** It's not true that an owl can turn its head all the way around. But an owl CAN turn its head three-quarters of the way around in both directions. That means it can see straight backwards!

SILENT FLIERS

Did You Know? Special fringed feathers on owls' wings help them fly without making a sound. Hunting in the dark of night, the owls can sneak up on their prey. You can create silent flight at home!

- ❖ Fold a sheet of paper into the shape of a paper airplane.
- ❖ Fly it and notice how silently it travels—very much like an owl.
- ❖ Turn the airplane into your favorite owl character from the movie by decorating it with the markings of its species. (See list below.)
