Project: Gideon worked with a student team at Warren Wilson College to design and implement Real Time Energy Monitoring in the campus's dorms. Applying technology developed by a visiting electrical engineer, the tool provides the campus with real-time feedback about student energy consumption. By making this information easily accessible via the Internet, the college community is easily educated on the impacts of their energy use. In addition, the tool can be used to compare building trends to EPA standards and other green building standards.

Biography: Gideon is currently working with the City of Flagstaff, AZ, Sustainability Program through the Americorps Program. In addition to organizing the Cities Earth Day events he's working with local businesses to assist in making their operations more sustainable and working with City operations to implement the Cities newly adopted Municipal Sustainability Plan. When the snow finally melts he's looking forward to assisting in enhancing, and participating in, the urban agriculture program.

Gideon on his Fellowship: *My NWF fellowship taught me not only project management skills but also opened my eyes to how one or two individuals truly can make a difference. While I was not able to complete the project I was able to see it to its initial implementation stages. I'm encouraged as Warren Wilson College has two students now working on the project and there is increased support. When the work I started as part of my fellowship becomes operational in buildings I'm confident that the students who are passionate will be able to make it a success.*
