ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Emma Mullaney

2005 Campus Ecology Fellow

Sarah Lawrence College, New York

Project: Emma organized town hall forums to discuss the local effects of energy practices and global warming, engaged campus and community members from the Hudson River corridor and emphasized social and environmental justice. Sarah Lawrence continues its dedication to sustainability through the College's Sustainability Committee.

What is she doing now?: *My tortoise, Chloe, and I live in central Pennsylvania, where we are currently exploring every nook and muching our way through a glorious harvest season. I am beginning my second year as a dual-degree PhD student in the Departments of Geography and Women's Studies at Penn State. In addition to studying, I have multiple teaching roles: instructing undergraduates through the Geography Department and horseback riders through the local Pony Clubs. As co-Director of the Guerrera Project and as a research associate with the Foundation for Post Conflict Development, I have recently been working in East Timor on the experiences of female veterans of the Timorese Resistance Movement. For my dissertation, I will be working with maize farming households in central Mexico and studying the ways in which they produce and maintain agrobiodiversity.*

Emma on her Fellowship: *The NWF Campus Ecology Fellowship gave me one of my first opportunities to take a formal leadership role in political debates about environmental issues that I was studying in school. It was a formative moment in applying my passions for research and activism in service of a lifelong dedication to the health of social and ecological justice.*

* Emma has also been recently elected as one of two Policy Advisors on Biological Diversity to the US youth organization, SustainUS . Emma will be representing SustainUS as part of a small exploratory delegation to the UN Convention on Biological Diversity in Nagoya, Japan this October.

2002 Campus Ecology Fellow

Project: Ron helped institute an operational refinery for the biodiesel production on campus. Facilities were set up to produce the fuel and run a test vehicle. The vehicle was used for educational purposes including demonstrations in local schools and community events. An awareness initiative coincided with the project to inform the college and local community of the project. Middlebury has continued their investment in alternative fuels and recently built a state-of-the-art wood chip heating plant.

What is he doing now?: Ron earned his master's degree from Dartmouth College and is now a high school history teacher at Suffield Academy in Connecticut where he also leads the campus sustainability organization. Ron served in the Peace Corps in Malawi and taught at the Mahindra United World College of India near Mumbai, India.

Ron on his Fellowship: *The NWF Fellowship helped me start a meaningful program on campus that got other students interested and excited about alternative fuels. I was surprised by the response, and in the following years we even sent a bus across the country powered on vegetable oil. I'm grateful the NWF Fellowship gave me the tools to make a small difference and soften my footprint on the planet. As a father now myself, I believe even more deeply in the importance of protecting the world we've inherited. I aspire for my son to enjoy the environment as I have.*

Protect Brown Pelicans from Future Disasters

The Brown Pelican comprises 58% of all dead or injured bird species collected in response to the BP oil spill. While there's nothing we can do to reverse this damage, we can help prevent it in the future.

Right now, a bill is being considered in the U.S. Senate that would help protect wildlife across America from future disasters like the BP Oil Spill.

A strong oil spill response bill will raise the liability and accountability of oil companies for spills, increase the safety of on- and offshore drilling, and secure critical conservation funding.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Cynthia Klein-Banai

2008 Campus Ecology Fellow

University of Illinois at Chicago

Project: Cindy established a data collection mechanism for performing an annual greenhouse gas inventory at UIC while completing the inventory for fiscal year 2007 and 2008. To the extent possible, she also collected data back to the early 2000s. Additionally, she conducted a survey of campus commuting practices and proposed a climate action plan. Aside from the immediate results of this project, long-term outcomes include greenhouse gas emissions reductions, reduced energy costs through energy conservation, and increased awareness of sustainable practices and their benefits by the campus and community.

Biography: Cindy got involved in the environmental movement in the 1970s, cleaning up streams and fundraising. She got her first job in the environmental field in Israel where she worked for the Ministry of Health. Cindy found the Office of Sustainability at UIC and has been serving as the associate chancellor for sustainability since January 2008. She holds a B.A. in biology from Washington University in St. Louis and an M.S. in environmental science from Hebrew University in Jerusalem. Cindy is currently a Ph.D. candidate in environmental and occupational health sciences at UIC and recently had a paper accepted for publication in *Environmental Practice*. She is conducting research on developing a point system for the Sustainability Tracking, Assessment and Rating System being developed by the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE).

Cindy on her Fellowship: *The Fellowship gave me a personal connection to a wide national network of people working at and with the National Wildlife Federation to accomplish similar goals of reducing greenhouse gas emissions and mitigating climate change. That personal relationship began with the training workshop at the start of the Fellowship and continues today in my research and career.*

Speak Up for the Gulf's Least Terns

This summer, the American Bird Conservancy identified Gulf Coast least tern colonies as a primary concern for bird habitats threatened by the Gulf oil spill disaster and associated cleanup activities. Some 83 least terns have been found dead along the Gulf Coast with nearly half of those showing obvious signs of oil, according to the U.S. Fish & Wildlife Service.

Restoration funding collected from the BP fines is crucial to restoring habitat that least terns and other bird species could use in the future.
