ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Manisha Rose Snoyer
2000 Campus Ecology Fellow
Brandeis University, MA

Project: Manisha helped close the 3R (reduce, reuse, recycle) loop in Brandeis' recycling program. With the support of the Recycling Club and environmental studies program, she developed a paper management plan to significantly reduce paper use on campus. Additionally, she conducted a cost-benefit analysis showing how reduction efforts compare to the increased cost of 100-percent-recycled paper. Brandeis is still making great strides in their recycling efforts, in 2008 the campus switched to a single-stream recycling method in which all recyclable items can be placed in the same receptacle. In addition, all of the waste from the dining halls is taken to a commercial composting facility called WeCare, and all other trash waste is sent to a trash to energy facility called Wheelabrator.

What she's doing now: Manisha is currently an actress in New York City and teaches acting in French to performing arts professionals and theatre lovers.

Manisha on her Fellowship:

I loved the program. It was great fun, incredibly well organized and supportive. The highlight was when I got to go to a conference in Washington, D.C. and meet environmental leaders as one of the four student reps. I did feel quite like an eco-rock star as a young college student at the time. I learned so much about how to promote projects of all kinds. I think in a way this project sealed my own personal commitment to living a sustainable life and bringing the principle of sustainability to all that I do.

Save Wolves from Dirty Oil

Tar sands operations in Canada are pushing woodland caribou to the brink of extinction as their habitat is destroyed.

Incredibly, Canada's proposed solution is to kill the wolves that prey on caribou, instead of protecting their habitat. Black bears that are being habituated in the tar sands region are also being shot and killed.

Despite President Obama's prudent rejection of the massive Keystone XL tar sands pipeline, Congress continues to try to force approval of this dangerous project – which would pump nearly one million barrels per day of tar sands oil through America's heartland.

In addition to endangering wildlife along its route, Keystone XL would greatly expand habitat-destroying tar sands development – and would mean fewer caribou, wolves, and black bears.

Tessa Haagenson

2005 Campus Ecology Fellow

Bemidji State University, MN

Project: Tessa organized town hall forums with campus and community members to discuss the effects of global warming and proposed a student fee to support the purchase of renewable energy on campus.

Due in large part to Tessa's work, a \$5 student green fee was initiated in the Fall of 2008. The fee generates approximately \$35-\$40,000 per year which funds student projects and the salary for a full-time sustainability coordinator.

What she's doing now: After graduating with a B.S. in environmental studies, Tessa went abroad for a semester as a guest graduate student in a sustainable energy and management program. She then worked for an environmental consulting and engineering firm. Currently Tessa is broadening her renewable energy path. She is back in school, pursuing a master's degree at the University of North Dakota in electrical engineering with a focus on renewable energy systems.

Tessa on her Fellowship:

The Fellowship was a wonderful experience for me personally, but more importantly, the project spurred additional student campaigns which have resulted in a campus sustainability coordinator, numerous energy efficiency improvements on campus and a growing group of students who participate in environmental efforts on campus.

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT

Emma Gaalaas Mullaney
2005 Campus Ecology Fellow
Sarah Lawrence College, NY

Project: Emma organized town hall forums to discuss the local effects of energy practices and global warming, engaged campus and community members from the Hudson River corridor and emphasized social and environmental justice. While for years there have been many independent efforts at greening the Sarah Lawrence Campus, as well as student attitudes, the November 2006 conference of the Environmental Consortium of Hudson Valley Colleges & Universities' Greening the Campus: Exploring Practices, Curriculum and Management in Higher Education served as a springboard for establishing a comprehensive long-term plan for campus greening, including the formation of a campus-wide sustainability committee.

What she's doing now: In March 2012, Emma lead a delegation of U.S. youth to the 2012 United Nations Commission on the Status of Women (CSW), held in New York, NY. The delegation represented the sustainable development and youth advocacy organization SustainUS, which works to increase youth participation in UN negotiations. At the CSW, Emma presented a research paper entitled "Countertopographies of Agriculture: Toward a Reframing of Gender, Food Production, and Development in a Globalizing World". This paper won first place in the Citizen Science Graduate Paper competition and will be published in the May 2012 issue of the development journal *Consilience*.

Emma has also served previously as a SustainUS Policy Advisor and Delegate to the UN Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) 10th Conference of the Parties, held in 2010 in Nagoya, Japan. There, she and fellow youth representative Hirotaka Matsui (of Japan's Eco League) delivered the Youth Opening Statement to the CBD Plenary Session. Emma has been invited to serve as Lead Delegate to the 2012 UN CBD Convention, to be held in October 2012 in Hyderabad, Andhra Pradesh, India, where she looks forward to continuing work with an international coalition of youth activists.

Emma is currently based in the Central Highland region of Mexico conducting eleven months of ethnographic fieldwork on maize diversity, livelihood struggles, and contested agricultural development while studying the indigenous Nahuatl language with support of a Boren Graduate Fellowship.

Emma on her Fellowship:

The NWF Campus Ecology Fellowship gave me one of my first opportunities to take a formal leadership role in political debates about environmental issues that I was studying in school. It was a formative moment in applying my passions for research and activism in service of a lifelong dedication to the health of social and ecological justice.
