Students don't understand globalization and how different countries interact with each other	Participate in Model UN, or develop a club that discusses similar issues	Interested students	February	We have looked into participating in Model UN or taken steps to establish a club	Participate in Model UN or start holding club meetings	Travel/ registration for Model UN, learning materials/ costs for running a club
