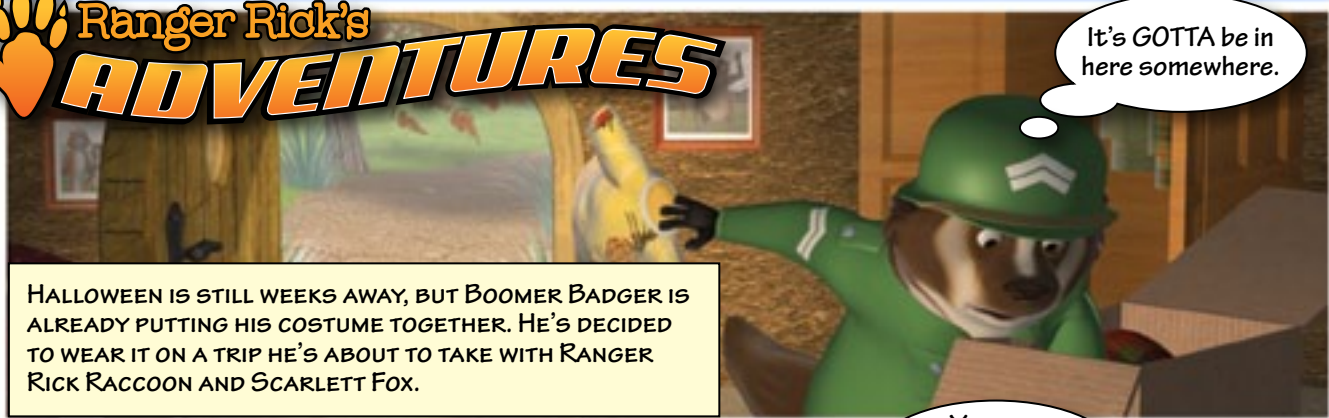


Ranger Rick's ADVENTURES

Got only one chance...



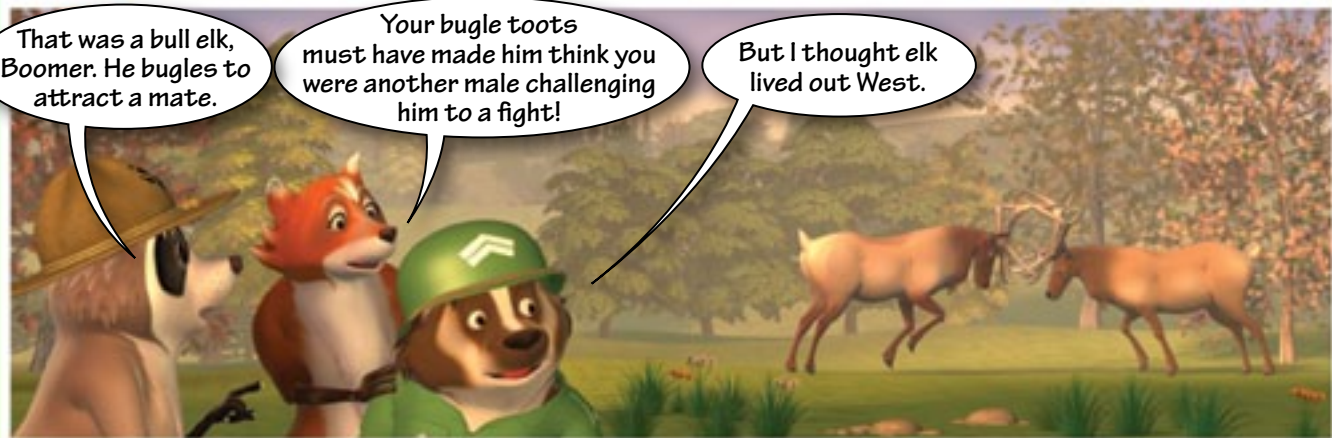
Are you all right, Boomer?

MORE FACTS

- Elk are a huge species of deer. A full-grown male (bull) can weigh up to 700 pounds—more than twice the size of a white-tailed deer.
- Even larger were the elk that once roamed across eastern North America, from Canada to the southern Appalachian Mountains. But then early settlers destroyed the elk's habitat. They cut down the forests and turned the land into farms. They also hunted elk for their meat and hides. By 1877, the eastern elk was extinct.

Elk still survived in the West. So beginning in the early 1900s, some of these elk were brought East to live in places where elk once thrived.

• In 1998, about 1,500 elk were brought to eastern Kentucky. That herd quickly grew and now has more than 11,000 elk—the largest herd east of the Mississippi River. About 150 of these elk have migrated into Virginia, where people are trying to make sure they have a happy new home!
