



2010 Election: New Faces in Congress, but Voters Still Want Clean Energy

Statement by Larry Schweiger, President and CEO of National Wildlife Federation:

Washington, DC (November 2, 2010) – “There will be many new faces in Congress next year, but voters overwhelmingly want the next Congress to find bi-partisan solutions that invest in clean energy sources, reduce harmful carbon pollution and end subsidies for Big Oil companies.”

“Americans want more clean energy action and less Big Oil scare tactics, and candidates who stand with Big Oil are out of touch with their electorate.

“In California, the world’s eighth-largest economy, early indications are that the voter backlash against Big Oil’s campaign spending is sending a message that there are great perils to siding with polluters.”
