



## **EPA Announces Responsible New Clean Air Measures**

Washington, DC (November 10, 2010) – The Obama administration today unveiled permitting requirements that will go into effect on new and modified large power plants and industrial facilities at the start of 2011 that will ensure the best available control technology (BACT) will be used.

Joe Mendelson, NWF director of global warming policy said:

“Today’s announcement shows the Clean Air Act remains a model for improving our environment using the latest technologies while spurring innovation and economic growth. The measure will both clean our air while giving plants flexibility and the opportunity to take costs into account.

“We commend EPA administrator Lisa Jackson and the Obama administration. The proposal is one more example of how the Environmental Protection Agency is wisely and responsibly cutting pollution.”
