


Eco-Schools USA Award Checklist: Silver

Use this handy checklist to help track your school's progress through the Eco-Schools USA program and confirm that you are meeting criteria to apply for a bronze level award. You will need a total of 200 points to qualify for a silver award.

Criteria	Points	Completed (√)	Notes	Tips
Eco-Action Team (Total 30 points)				
Eco-Action Team is composed of students, teachers, and community members.	10			Consider connecting with resource professionals from local government or conservation organizations.
The Eco-Action Team meets a minimum of six times a year.	10			Some schools meet more frequently in the beginning and then scale back meetings once their program has become established.
Students are part of the decision-making process and help keep minutes at Eco-Action Team meetings.	5			If they are old enough give students the opportunity to lead some of the team meetings.
Student members of the Eco-Action Team share information with the school.	5			Allow students to determine how they will share information and in what form.
Environmental Audit (Total 35 points)				
An audit is completed on a formal basis using the Eco-Schools USA Audit Form for at least two Pathways.	15			Include as many members of the school community in the auditing process as possible.




Criteria	Points	Completed (✓)	Notes	Tips
Environmental Audit (continued)				
Students are involved in the auditing process.	10			Determine which audit steps are safe for students to complete and which should be completed by an adult.
Results of the audit are shared with the whole school.	5			Go over audit results at an assembly or include them in a school-wide newsletter.
The audit is completed at least once.	5			We recommend that you complete the audit annually in order to measure and evaluate improvement in your school's environmental performance.
Eco-Action Plan (Total 35 points)				
Create an action plan based on audit results that has quantifiable targets and a timeframe. Your action plan should focus on two pathways. Pathways: _____	20			One of the two pathways can be the pathway you focused on when applying for the bronze level award.
The action plan is shared with the entire school and local community.	5			Contact your local newspaper and ask the paper to publicize details about the success of your Eco-Schools USA Program.

Eco-Action Plan (continued)				
A range of actions are planned to mitigate environmental problems.	10			Prioritize your actions by dividing them into what is achievable in the short, medium and longer term.
Monitor & Evaluate (Total 35 points)				
The Eco-Action Team monitors and reviews progress against timeframes and targets outlined in the action plan.	15			Your procedure for monitoring progress should be developed in parallel with the action plan.
Progress and challenges are communicated to the whole school.	5			Progress and challenges should also be recorded in meeting minutes.
The school shows significant progress on one large-scale project that is focused on the two Eco-Schools pathways	5			Think about a large-scale project that incorporates two complimentary pathways.
Metrics data is entered on the award application for the pathway(s) your school is focusing on.	10			You should be able to pull metrics data from the pathways audit forms.
Link to Curriculum (Total 25 points)				
Environmental issues are integrated into the classroom at all grade levels and across disciplines.	15			You may not be able to integrate across as many disciplines as you'd like, but you should make an effort to integrate across as many as possible to show it is a whole school effort.

Link to Curriculum (continued)				
Student experiences are integrated into the curriculum and are inquiry-based.	10			We have a list of recommended curriculum on the Eco-Schools USA website, under each pathway.
Community Involvement (Total 20 points)				
The school has a bulletin board, website or newsletter which details Eco-Schools USA activities.	10			See if students can write content as part of their English class or for journalism class.
The whole school, along with volunteers from the community engage in a number of Eco-Schools activities.	10			Consider holding a special event or rally to educate people and get them engaged.
Eco-Code (Total 20 points)				
An Eco-Code is developed that includes input from the whole school, and is agreed upon and adopted and is displayed in the school.	20			It should demonstrate, in a clear and imaginative way, your school's commitment to improving its environmental performance.



Applying for a Silver Award

STEPS

1	Check the Eco-Schools USA map (www.eco-schoolsusa.org/map) to find out if your school is already registered as an Eco-School. If not, go to our registration page (www.eco-schoolsusa.org/registration) and sign-up! Complete the registration form and click 'submit'.
2	If you previously registered as an Eco-School, login to access your school's profile. You do this by going to the registration page (www.eco-schoolsusa.org/registration) and clicking on the green arrow that says 'login'. You will need to enter your email and password.
3	Once on your school's profile page, locate the 'submit new form' section. Using the pull down menu select the silver award level and click 'submit'.
4	Fill-out the award application and click 'submit'. If the application is only partially completed you can click 'save' and return to it at a later point.
5	If the application is successfully entered and all criteria met, your school will automatically receive the Eco-Schools USA Silver Award. A blue hyperlink will appear on your school's profile page. Click on it to download your award certificate.
